performing artists

Approximately three high school students, three college students and three young adults beginning their professional careers. Of these, preferably one pianist, one organist, five vocalists and two instrumentalists. Most performers are soloists, but duets or small ensembles are strongly encouraged. Musicians interested in performing should email music@IHMBrooklyn.org

repertoire

Anything you want, does not need to be sacred, though in the case of vocal texts, something with a positive message is preferred, as it is being performed in a sacred space. All musical styles welcome; classical, contemporary, sacred, jazz, musical theatre and pop. High school and college students may do one piece, young professionals may do two if they wish. Strongly recommended are selections you’ve performed before, especially of the “encore” type. Recitals of this format are usually not the best venue to “try out” a piece you’ve just learned.

accompaniment

You may bring your own, or Steven Vaughan, the Director of Music Ministry is available to accompany you with advance rehearsal. Pre-recorded tracks are not allowed.

rehearsal

There isn’t a scheduled rehearsal, it’s up to individuals to schedule one if they need it. Performers are strongly encouraged to come perform at a liturgy at Immaculate Heart of Mary though, to familiarize themselves with the space and acoustics.

tickets

Free, with a goodwill offering.

dress

Smart-business. No color restrictions or tuxedos.
